BURTON. FRANCIS HENRY. [East Durham.]

S. of the late Rev. J. E. Burton, A.B. (T.C.D.), sometime Church of Eng. missionary at Rawdon. L.C., afterwards Vicar of Dysart and Prebend of Donoughamore, Irel., and author of An Essay on Comparative Agriculture (Mont., 1828), to which was awarded the medal of the Soc. for the Encouragement of Arts and Science of Quebec. B. in Galway, Irel., 1817. Ed. at Chambly, P.Q. M. Ann., dau. of John Brown, Esq., who represented Durham in the L.A., of U.C. Sat for present seat in L. A., Can., from 1854 to 1861, when defeated, but succeeded by petition in having election declared void and order made for new writ. Journals, 1863.) Contested same seat unsuccessfully at g. e. 1851 and at g. e. 1863. Returned to the Commons at last g. e. A Conservative, and a supporter of Sir John A. Macdonald. Port Hope, Ont.
