Board of Management to ascertain her fitness for the work. If suitable, she will continue the course of training in the practice of District Nursing, with technical instruction for five months, during which period she will be considered a Probationer.

The Probationer will receive an allowance of fifteen dollars a month. She will be provided with board and laundry and as far as possible with a separate bedroom or cubicle and a sitting room in common; also with uniform dress, which must be worn on duty, and considered the property of the Order.

After admission to the Order, and on being assigned a District, a Victorian Nurse will be paid a salary of not less than three hundred dollars a year, with board, lodging, laundry and uniform. Those who are appointed to be Superintendents will be paid a higher rate of salary according to the work and responsibility required of them.

The nursing of patients shall be conducted under the direction of a medical practitioner.

A nurse shall be on duty for eight hours daily. On Sundays she shall only attend cases requiring special or immediate attention.

A nurse shall be entitled to one month's holiday annually.
