An Act to explain the Act passed in the now last Session, relative to certain duties of Excise in Upper Canada.

WHEREAS it is expedient to explain the Act of the Legislature of ^{Preamble.} this Province, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her Majesty, intituled, *An Act to repeal certain duties of Excise, so far as regards Upper Canada, and to vest certain powers in the Municipal* 5 *authorities of that part of the Province*; Be it therefore declared and enacted, &c., That nothing in the said Act contained was intended or shall be construed as being intended to require, or as authorising any Municipal authority to require, the payment of any money or the taking out of any license or licenses, in order to authorize or make it lawful for any 10 person or persons, his, her, or their agents or servants, to carry abroad, expose to sale or sell by retail or otherwise, any goods, wares, or merchandize of the growth, produce, or manufacture of this Province, and having been grown, made, or manufactured by such person or persons, his, her, or their servants, agents, or workmen.

Intention of the said act as to Hawkers and Pedlers declared.
