Slow start behind hot Realtors

Notice has been served to the OLA Junior B Central division — the Mississauga Realtors are on the move.

The Realtors, who got off to a slow 2-4 start, won their fourth consecutive game Monday night by stunning the previously unbeaten Etobicoke Raiders 14-8 in Etobicoke. Friday night the Realtors dumped Oakville Clippers 17-9 to move into undisputed possession of second place.

"The players are starting to find their own style," said coach Duncan

Croft. "They're getting to know each other and are developing a freestyle offence."

There were two common denominators in both of last week's victories — strong goaltending and a strong third period.

New line stops Builders nosedive

When the Mississauga Builders lost the league's top scorer, Rob Gemmill, last week coach Butch Keegan hoped that a new line would take up the scoring slack.

Keegan's hopes were

finally realized last Wednesday night as the Builders snapped a three-game losing streak by dumping the expansion Windsor Warlocks 23-13 in an OLA Junior A lacrosse game at Huron Park Arena.

The match was much closer than the score indicates. The Builders scored 11 times in the last period after leading 12-11 after the second. A line shift by Keegan provided some badly needed scoring punch with the absence of Gemmill from the first line, the top scoring line in Junior A lacrosse.

The new line of Randy Dupre, who has moved into the top five in the league scoring race, Ron Smith, Rick Halliday, Tony Smith and Pat Schnur kept the Builders in contention during the tight first two periods. Ron Smith scored five goals in those two periods and credited his new line and some hard work in a practice session for assisting him.

"The practice was really good because we went off to a side and worked on some plays," said Smith. "One of the plays worked when I got my third goal at the beginning of the second period."

The play involves circular motion around the goal as the left wing, overloading the right side, hit the open man, usually the second or third man coming through. The play is lifted right out of the basketball textbook, though Keegan said he used it while playing for the Long Island Tomahawks last year.

"I found out that Dupre's line used it last year too," said Keegan. "So it was just a matter of working it out in practice the other night."

George Chandler scored five goals for the first time in four games and looked happy about it after the game, despite the fact that four of them came near the end of the third period when Windsor started to give up.

Mike McMillan, Jeff Skinner and Bob McMahon scored a pair of goals each. Singles came from Tony Smith, Beck Hoffland, Stu Aird, Dupre, Schnur, Curtis Erion and Russ Plumb.

Gemmill is expected to return to action against the last place Mimico Mountaineers tonight at Huron Park at 8:00. He wanted to play in Saturday's all-star game but it was deemed too risky. Gemmill was in hospital for a week.

Czechs play Arrows

The Mississauga Golden Arrows will get their first taste of international hockey in December.


Arrows president Les Gall confirmed last week that the second-year OHA Senior A hockey team will meet a team from Czechoslovakia in late December. Port Credit Memorial Arena has been selected as the site.

"From what I understand the team is to be the Czech national team," Gall said. "I imagine there'll be a lot of younger players with them, but we've been assured that Milan Novy and Vladimir Dzurilla will be here."

The Arrows are taking part in an exchange between the OHA and Czech hockey foundation.

An OHA Senior A team, selected in a November tournament, will tour Czechoslovakia from Dec. 10 to 24. The Czech team will tour Ontario from Dec. 28 to Jan. 9.

"We're really looking forward to it," said Gall. "I expect we'll have a crowd of about 3,000."

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Mississauga on the 13th day of June, 1977, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as the Robinson-Adamson House at 1921 Dundas St. West (part of Lot 2, Range 1, NDS), as a property of historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

SHORT STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION:

The Robinson-Adamson House is recommended for designation on the architectural grounds that it is a particularly fine example of a Regency cottage with its elegant trim and gracious proportions. It is historically important as the summer residence of John Beverley Robinson (about 1830) who was then Attorney-General of the Province of Upper Canada and later Chief Justice and the President of the Executive Council. Robinson was a major figure in the history of the province.


Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of June 22, 1977.
