Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Mississauga on the 13th day of June, 1977, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as the Robinson-Adamson House at 1921 Dundas St. West (part of Lot 2, Range 1, NDS), as a property of historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

SHORT STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION:

The Robinson-Adamson House is recommended for designation on the architectural grounds that it is a particularly fine example of a Regency cottage with its elegant trim and gracious proportions...It is historically important as the summer residence of John Beverley Robinson (about 1830) who was then Attorney-General of the Province of Upper Canada and later Chief Justice and the President of the Executive Council. Robinson was a major figure in the history of the province.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of June 22, 1977.




