Argument that preference heretofore has been of advantage to Britain only -

shows sorry mentality - that in reality there is no advantage in lowering of tariffs.

What then becomes of alleged gains of this Conference?

Trade not war, based on exchange - allexchange of mutual value or would not take place.

British preference given in 1897 -

Liberal policy -

help to producers and consumers, to imperial unity and world trade.

Policy retained by Borden, etc.

Kept down cost of living and production costs - as artificially raised.

Helped revenues; cannot sell and not buy; ships must have cargoes both ways; helped British trade.

Whether it did this or not look at figures of trade while Liberals in office under Laurier and King.

Given because we felt it to be to our advantage for domestic reasons as well as reasons of imperial policy.

Believed in lower tariffs.
