I have to request you to be good enough to survey into sections that portion of the Michel Indian Reserve, No. 132, shown, bordered green, on the plan herewith enclosed, comprising the strip along the west boundary, about a mile and a half wide. The said strip has been surrendered by the Indians to be sold for their benefit, and it is desired to place the land in the market this fall. It is, therefore, hoped that you will proceed to make this survey without any delay.

The survey is to be made in all respects similar to subdivision surveys made for the Department of the Interior, and as directed in the Manual published by that Department for the guidance of surveyors.

The lines are to be run, as directed in the said Manual, on the west and south limits of the road allowances, that is where such allowances occur. All the lines to be run are shown on the plan enclosed. You will note that these are productions of the lines of the sections bordering on the reserve. All the points are to be marked as usual with iron posts, mounds and pits.
