Col P. Schuyler dated the 2nd Instant
addressing the Castle of the Magruse by
an Onondago called Tunkawo whom
by letter inform of that some
interests had ^{Monsieur Longue} the French in company
with him arrived at Onondaga
10 days ago and then are busy building
a ^{house} of plank & refer you to the
Indian for further information who
being examined
that Monsieur Longue & Tunkawo
and another soldiers came to Onondaga
17 days ago they were designed to stay
there about 2 months longer
and that had sent some of their people
to lead him and that they not yet
made any proposals but they are busy
surveying of Boards that the Indians
had them a lot in the middle of their
castle Monsieur Longue called by
the Indians a Sinunup was to be the
owner there of and to live there always
That there are 2 Indians of the Magruse
Onondaga Praying called Jatach & wigjorahish
with the 1st French Gent. at Onondaga
