HALTONVILLE.

A village in the Township of Nassagaweya, situated on the stage road leading from Wellington Square to Guelph, distant from the former 20 miles, 14 from the latter, and 12 miles from Milton. It contains one church, the Canada Presbyterian Church, built of stone, of handsome appearance, in 1862, at a probable cost of \$3,000, having capacity to seat 350 persons. There is a very nice cemetery attached. Rev. Jas. Little, Minister. The congregation was formed at the time of the early settlement of the Township of Nassagaweya by the Rev. Mr. Ferguson, now deceased; the Rev. Mr. Meldrum then labored for some time, giving occasional supply till his labors in East Puslinch became so onerous that he was forced to resign, Rev. A. J. Macauley was then the choice of the congregation, who labored earnestly and faithfully for ten years, when in 1863 he was called to his rest. The congregation was vacant three years before their present pastor, the Rev. J. Little was settled over them. Generally speaking, they are all in easy circumstances, enjoying the fruits of their industry in the past. The village has a good drill shed, one first-class hotel, two stores, and a Town Hall.
