Two years ago one-half of my seed failed to grow at all—had to replant with other seed. Are you still selling that good, sound Mammoth Southern Sweet Corn that I used to buy from you? If so, what would it cost me per bushel, delivered in bond? And have you some good earlier varieties that you can recommend as large yielders of ensilage? We like some earlier that will mature for ensilage. Earlier varieties make richer and sweeter silage, but not so much of it to the acre. I grow 60 acres for silage. Yours truly,
