





A handsome new altar has lately been placed in the Church of the Incarnation, Great Falls, in the Diocese of Montana. It is of solid oak, hand carved, and is the gift of St. Agnes' Guild.

In connection with the Pan-Anglican Congress, which is to be held in the summer, an effort is to be made to raise money on a scale which has never been attempted by any religious body. It is proposed to provide a thanksgiving fund of £5,000,000. There are altogether 249 dioceses connected with the Anglican Church in all parts of the world, and it is hoped that nearly all the Bishops of these diocese will be present and that they will each bring a handsome contribution to the Thanksgiving Fund. It is expected that between seven and eight thousand delegates will attend this Congress, and there is reason to hope that all of these will be guests of members of the Anglican community in London. The committee which is arranging for the reception of the visitors is receiving many offers of hospitality of this character.

At the recent Advent Ordinations in Great Britain 241 deacons were ordained in all, which is an increase of 34 in 1906. This is the highest number since 1899. There were 206 priests ordained, making the sum total of the ordinands 507, as compared with 487 the previous year.
