And the second Resolution being also read and the question put thereon, a division again ensued, which proved the same as the last mentioned.

And the third Resolution being read, and the question put, the House divided thereon--

Majority of three in the affirmative.

The fourth Resolution being also read, the House divided upon the question.

Nays 7

Majority of four in the affirmative.

And the fifth Resolution being read and the question put thereon, a division ensued, which proved the same as the last mentioned.

And the sixth, seventh, eighth and ninth Resolutions of the Committee, being severally read as the foregoing, and the question of concurrence severally put thereupon; and the House dividing upon each; the respective divisions were
