Resolved, That the Bill be now read a second time, and the same was read a fecond time accordingly.

Resolved, That the Bill be committed to a Committee of the whole House.

On motion, resolved, that the amendments made by the Council to the Pictou Academy Bill, be committed to a Committee of the whole House and thereupon,

On motion, the House resolved itself into a committee of the whole House, on the confideration of the faid amendments, and also of the several Bills

which flood committed.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. Wells took the Chair,

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair.

The Chairman reported from the Committee, that they had gone through the Bill for altering the time of the Sitting of the Inferior Court of Common Pleas at Digby; also, the Bill in amendment of the Acts for regulating the exportation of Fish, &c. and for appointing proper Officers for measuring Grain, Salt, &c. : and that the committee had directed him to report the faid Bills, feverally, without any amendment. That the Committee had gone through the engroffed Bill from the Council to alter and extend the times of holding the Supreme Court in the several Counties and Districts of this Province: and had made several amendments thereunto, which they had directed him to report to the House. And that the Committee had also gone through the amendments made by the Council to the Pictou Academy Bill, part of which amendments the Committee had agreed to, and part rejected; and further, that the Committee recommended that a Conference should be held with the Council on the subject matter of the said amendments: and he afterwards delivered the daid Bills, and the respective amendments to the same, in at the Clerk's table on the out of more propagations granded by a rate out

The Chairman also acquainted the House, that he was directed by the Committee to move for leave to fit again on the confideration of the several Bills to them referred: which report the House agreed to the state of the state of
