Winnipeg, Jan. 7.—(Special.)—The bill of particulars on which the petition to unseat Hon. Hugh John Macdonald is based was filed to-day. 'It contains over one hundred charges of bribery by agents, but there are no personal charges against Mr. Macdonald. Several of Winnipeg's most prominent citizens, including J. H. Brock, Thomas Kelly, D. D. Wood, T. H. Gilmour, W. H. Hastings, E. L. Drewry, William Georgeson. Daniel Sprague, Frank Fairchild and Dr. Englis are charged with wrongful acts in Hugh John's interests. It will take a month to hear evidence on all the sharges. The Tribune, Liberal organ, publishes to-night the complete bill of particulars, which occupies two pages. It is stated to-night that Hon. Hugh John Macdonald will resign the seat for Winnipeg, and announce himself as a candidate for re-election. There is now little doubt that Mr. Martin will be the Liberal candidate.
