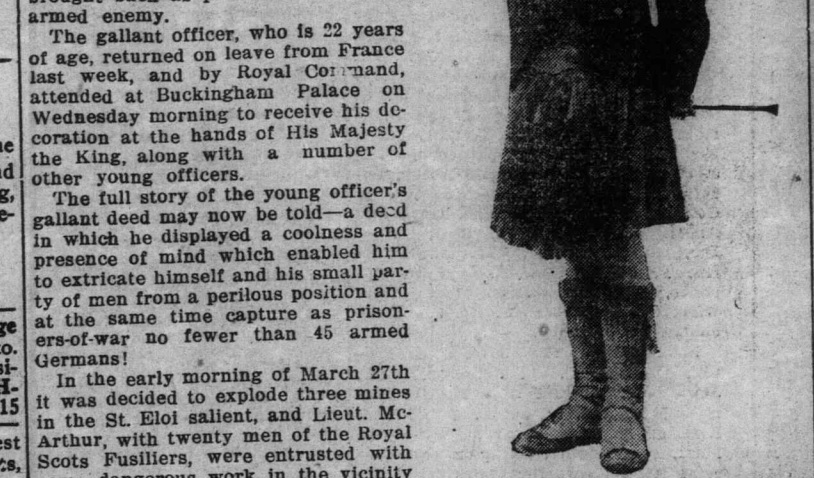

It was announced recently that Second-Lieut. William B. McArthur, of the 1st Battalion Royal Scots Fusiliers, second son of Mr. and Mrs. McArthur, of Danbury, Montserrat, New Malden, has been awarded the Military Cross for conspicuous gallantry at the front. The deed for which he received the award is officially described as follows by the "Surrey Comet" of May 29th last:—

For conspicuous determination when in charge of a working party of men from a trench and brought back as prisoners over forty armed enemy. The gallant officer, who is 22 years of age, returned on leave from France last week, and by Royal Command, attended at Buckingham Palace on Wednesday morning to receive his decoration at the hands of His Majesty the King, along with a number of other young officers.

The full story of the young officer's gallant deed may now be told—a deed in which he displayed a coolness and presence of mind which enabled him to extricate himself and his small party of men from a perilous position and at the same time capture as prisoners-of-war no fewer than 45 armed Germans!

On the early morning of March 27th it was decided to explode three mines in the St. Eloi salient, and Lieut. McArthur, with twenty men of the Royal Scots Fusiliers, were entrusted with some dangerous work in the vicinity of these mines. Before the Lieutenant and his men could return to safety the mines exploded and the contour of the ground was so altered by the explosions that in the darkness the party lost their way. As they were proceeding cautiously in what they thought was the direction of the British trenches, five figures suddenly appeared in front of them. Immediately on Lieut. McArthur challenging the strangers, "Who goes there?"—an illuminating shell burst and revealed the helmet of a German officer who was the leading man of the five. "Halt!" shouted Lieut. McArthur, at the same time drawing his revolver and dropping on his knee. Two shots rang out in the darkness, and the German officer fell, mortally wounded; with the remainder of the off-icers a search was made for three corporals with the party then came from behind, and Lieut. McArthur, on his (the Lieutenant's) shoulder, the fifth man was disposed of.

While the German officer was lying on the ground the corporal was lying on his back, and Lieut. McArthur, as a "brave British officer" to come to him. Suspecting treachery, however, the officer not having been disarmed, three British soldiers, who were ordered to comply with the request, and proceeded with his duties. As the call for the corporal's name was repeated, the corporal eventually went to ascertain what the German officer wanted. On reaching him the German took the iron cross off his breast and handed it to the corporal.

Being called to dinner by the striking peal of a bell made of a cannon shell was a novelty in use in Toronto. The bell shown in the sketch was made of a 3-inch brass shell, and when struck with a gavel gives out tones that penetrate throughout a large house. The cap piece was removed at A, and an eyebolt fastened in place with a nut on each side. The gong was suspended from a wall bracket made of a band of brass fastened to the wall.—Popular Mechanics.

FOOLISH PARROTS
New Zealand Natives Catch Them Cleverly and Easily
The New Zealand kakapo, or large parrot, with all its credit for brains, allows itself to be caught in a very simple manner. In the dusk of the early dawn the Maori, carrying tame kakapos tied to long sticks, set off to hunt. These are the call-birds used to attract by their screams the large flocks of kakapos flying overhead. When one Maori tethers the call-birds by the leg, and sets them screaming to the full extent of their lusty lungs, another cuts as many perches as there are men in the hunting party from the neighboring bush. By means of a large flock of parrots, hearing their cries, penetrate through the trees. Each perch is so fixed that it can be drawn into the "whare" through the roof. On the perches are placed running nooses of flax, and when all is prepared, each Maori sits quietly within the "whare" with his flax cord in hand ready to pull at the right moment.
