## RUSSIAN DRIVE IN SOUTH IS MAKING CENTRE PRECARIOUS

### Whole German Line in the East Will be Relinquished by the Enemy is Russian Belief—Russians are Now Fully and Splendidly Equipped

With the Russian armies on the Central Russian Front, Tuesday, Aug. 15, via Petrograd to London, Aug. 18.—The continued success of General Brusiloff's two powerful movements which gradually are enveloping Kovle and Lemberg, have begun to have a marked effect on the situation in the central portion of the front, which, except for small Russian gains in the lake region south of Drinsk, has remained virtually unaltered since the Russians fell back last August to the line from Drinsk to the Pinsk marshes. The Austrian line now has receded so far before the repeated thrusts of the south-western Russian forces in Southern Poland and Galicia that the Germans are in danger of a flanking movement from the south and the automatic retirement of the forces opposed to the Russian centre.

Despite the desultory bursts of activity at various points Russian officers say there are many indications that the Germans are prepared to abandon their present line on this part of the front at any moment. The correspondent of the Associated Press made a week's tour along the front commanded by Gen. Alexei Evert from Lake Narocz to the region of Baranovichi, and found the Russian soldiers most anxious for an opportunity to advance as soon as the command is given. The armies commanded by General Evert are the same which, crippled by a shortage of ammunition and supplies, were forced to surrender a large part of Poland a year ago. Commanders who brought back only broken remnants of their divisions to the present positions now are in charge of splendidly-equipped units. The men share with their officers the determination to recapture the ground lost in Poland.

A corps commander who showed the correspondent of the Associated Press a huge supply of ammunition and material at the disposal of one part of the force engaged in this section of the front, said: "We have enough ammunition stowed away to take us to Berlin."

The soldiers seem to be plentifully supplied with wholesome food, and are living under the best sanitary conditions. They are surrounded by comforts and conveniences comparable to those of a model American summer camp. The spirit and fighting strength of the Russian soldiers appears to be very high, and the troops confidently expect to occupy their original quarters in Western Poland.

Compared with conditions prevailing a year ago, the percentage of disease on this section of the front is declared to be appreciably lower. Not only has universal vaccination and personal cleanliness, which are now insisted upon, removed the danger of epidemics, but individual cases of a disease of any sort are said to be rare.

**EXPLANATION COMES BUT IS BELATED**  
**MARKETS**  
Germans Hurry to Explain Removal of Civilians from District of Lille.  
By Special Wire to the Courier.  
Berlin, Aug. 18, by wireless to Seydlitz—A German officer, who until recently, was an aide de camp in the Lille district of northern France, has given the Overseas News Agency service an account of his experiences during the removal of the civilian population from Lille, as it has been alluded to by the press in hostile countries.

"The main reason for sending a part of the civilian population from Lille," the officer is quoted by the news agency as saying, "was that the town was being furiously shelled by the British, who do not show the regard for French cities that the French artillerymen do. In addition to this there had been much difficulty in the distribution of food in the congested districts of the city. There were civilians from the densely populated workingmen's quarters were sent away. By no means all civilians were sent; only those from the quarters mentioned.

**ESCAPED FROM SHELTER**  
Woodstock, Aug. 18.—Mabel Dell, who escaped from the Children's Shelter here two years ago and joined her mother in Detroit, arrived back in the city a few days ago and was apprehended by the police. She was handed over to Children's Aid Society, and on her first night there stole a number of articles and made her second escape. She was captured in a wood shanty in Deerpark and brought before the magistrate to-day. He allowed her to go, but assessed the three men who aided her to escape \$5 and costs.

**AUSTRIAN'S CASE DISMISSED**  
Charge of Aiding Others to Enter U.S.—Likely to be Interned  
Niagara Falls, Ont., Aug. 18.—Mike Mariniak, an Austrian, who holds Canadian citizenship papers, and the proprietor of a boarding house at 200 Sherman Ave., Hamilton, was in the police court yesterday charged with attempting to assist three other Austrians into the United States. Magistrate Fraser dismissed the case. Mariniak was turned over to the military authorities, and it is likely that he will be interned.
