FRENCH MAKE GAINS

Capture Many Prisoners

Paris, Sept. 13 - North of the Somme, the French enlarged their positions opposite Combles, and stormed new trenches south of Priez, says the official statement issued by the war office tonight. After desperate attack the Germans recaptured a farm in L'Abbe Wood and Hill 76 But both were retaken by the French, who maintained all their gains on the centre and on the right. The total captures of yesterday and today were 2,300 prisoners, tea guns and forty machine guns.

FRENCH STRIKE SWIFT BLOW

London, September 12 - The French struck another swift blow north of the Somme today. Foch's troops, in a vigorous assault, battered at the German line from Combles to the river. Within half an hour they had won an entire first line of German trenches, taking more than 1,500 prisoners. The quickness of the French thrust took the enemy by surprise. Before the attack could be checked, the the Pollus had reached the road from Bethune to Peronne, where they carried by storm a system of trenches which had been strongly fortified.

By this stroke, Foch has attained positions from which Peronne can be outflanked from the north. The French grip in the Bethune-Peronne road is an immediate threat to Mont St Quentin, the very important height which is the key to Peronne itself.
