A special train will run to Brockville this evening in connection with the Athens-Brockville hockey match.

Messrs E. Davis & Son of Smith's Falls have opened a first-class livery in the Gamble House stables.

Rev. W. Hilliard Smith, rector of Lyndhurst, will conduct the evening service in Christ's Church next Sunday.

Recorder: Chas. Hillis has purchased the harness business of E. J. Billings in the Gallena block.

This week twelve cases of smallpox are reported at Maxville and one near Algonquin.

Carman, the little son of Mr and Mrs John Layng, has been seriously ill for several days with pneumonia.

Mrs A. Stevens of Delta is this week visiting at the home of her brother, Mr Almeron Robinson.

Quarterly services will be conducted in the Methodist church on Sunday morning next.

Mr E. C. Barber of Nyack, N.Y., is visiting friends here and at Plum Hollow.

Mr Gordon Lawson, late of the rural telephone exchange, leaves this week to teach the school at Rookspring.

In connection with the Athens-Brockville hockey match this evening an excursion train is being run to Brockville.

A meeting of representatives of the Leeds and Grenville Rural Telephone Federation will be held in the council chamber of the town hall, Athens, on the afternoon of Thursday, Feb. 16.

We are pleased to be able to report that Mr B. Loverin, who has been confined to his bed for several days, is now gaining.

It has been decided to re-build the rectory of this parish, destroyed by fire several weeks ago, and it is expected that work will be commenced early in the spring.

Feb. is said to stand for "freeze everybody"—and we appear to be getting it so far this month. On Sunday evening at 6 the mercury stood at 10 below zero; at 10 o'clock it marked 16 below.

The B. W. & N. W. officials did remarkably well in fighting the big storm of last week. There was comparatively little delay in the train service.

Archbishop Gauthier will leave Kingston for Montreal on February 15. Kingston Catholics will present his Grace with \$2,000 and the priests will give him a pectoral cross.

The village council held only a brief session on Monday evening. An account of the Chief for \$3.21 was ordered paid and matters of general interest to the village were discussed.

Mr W. Greenham returned home from the Canadian West on Monday evening. After having looked over the country carefully, he decided that Leeds County was good enough for him.

Probate of the will of Mary Hefferman, late of the township of Yonge, widow, has been granted to Charles E. Hefferman, of the same place, farmer, one of the executors, the other executor, D. Hefferman, having renounced. T. R. Bale, Athens, solicitor.

Messrs P. J. Quigley of Delta and W. H. Murphy of Portland are moving through their solicitors, Messrs. Hutchison & Fisher, to quash the local option by-law in Bastard. The affidavits charge that the statutes were violated in allowing a large number of voters in the polling booths during the day; improper canvassing and improper publicity in receiving the votes of the electors.

Albert Carrol, a farmer residing near Westport, committed suicide on Saturday evening by drinking carbolic acid. He had recently purchased a farm, and thinking he had made a mistake became despondent. He was aged 46 and had been married only two years.

The carnival, postponed from last Thursday, was held last evening and proved very enjoyable. A number of unique and beautiful costumes were worn, and the rink presented a very pretty appearance.

On Thursday evening, Feb. 16, Rev. W. F. Fitzgerald, M.A., B.D., of Kingston, will give his famous lecture on "Ireland and the Irish" in the church hall, Lyndhurst. No one of Irish descent should miss hearing this address.

The high school entrance examinations for 1911 will begin on Monday, June 26th at 1.15 p.m. and close at 3.30 p.m. the following Wednesday. The education department will maintain a high standard in the papers. The examinations for entrance into the model schools will also commence on June 26th.

Mr A. E. Donovan, M.P.P., has introduced in the Ontario legislature a bill changing the date of municipal elections. It is proposed to hold nominations on the second Monday in January and elections a week later. The change is in every respect most desirable and if it does not too greatly affect the book-keeping of the province the bill will probably become law.

Mr and Mrs B. Loverin wish through the columns of the Reporter to return their sincere thanks to their many friends in Athens, as well as in Vancouver, California, Brockville, Morris-town and elsewhere for the many expressions of sympathy with Mr Loverin during his six months of illness. While still confined to his bed, he has the careful care of two physicians and, while his condition is still serious, there seems to be a fair possibility of his recovery.

The new reciprocity tariff is framed largely in the interest of Canadian farmers. Following is a Watertown (N.Y.) view of its probable effects: At present the duty on both butter and cheese is six cents per pound. This accounts for the fact that last year while cheese was selling in the Canadian markets for 10 and 11 cent sales were being made on the Watertown Produce Exchange for 14 to 16 cents. Reciprocity in so far as butter and cheese are concerned, would tend to equalize prices and as a result would mean that the farmers and dairymen would be obliged to take less for their product in Northern New York than at the present time under existing conditions.

In a match with Phillipsville hockey team, played at that village on Saturday last, Athens team won out with a score of 13 to 5. This places Athens in the lead for the Penwarden cup.
