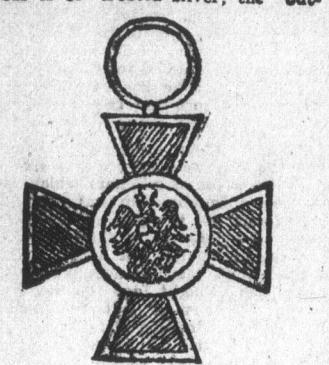

THE RED EAGLE.
Kaiser Wilhelm Decorates Consul-General
Nordheimer, of Toronto, in the Form
of a Maltese Cross.



Mr. Samuel Nordheimer, German
Consul for the Province of Ontario,
has been honored by the Kaiser.
In recognition of his able services
as Consul the distinguished Order of
the Red Eagle has been conferred
upon him.
The decoration is in the form of a
Maltese Cross, and is the exact size
of the accompanying sketch. The
cross is of frosted silver, the out-
lines being a narrow polished band.
The centre of the circle is of white
enamel on which a red eagle extends
his wings. On his head is a golden
crown, and in his talons he grasps
green laurel leaves.
The reverse is the same, with the
exception that the centre is frosted
like the rest, and on it appear in
polished relief the royal initials "F.
W." surmounted by a crown.
The decoration is not only a For-
eign Office recognition of merit, but
a personal decoration from the Em-
peror.

How Chamels Skins Are Made.
The sheepskin is first washed and
the flesh side scraped thoroughly to
remove the fleshy fibres; then the wet
skins are hung in a warm room for
about a week and "sweated." This
loosens the wool so that most of it
can be pulled out easily. The skins
are then soaked in milk of lime to
loosen the rest of the wool and to
soften the fibres and split them into
their constitutional fibrils. After
liming, the hair is all removed, and
the absorbed lime is neutralized with
boric or hydrochloric acid, and the
skin is split into two thicknesses.
The outer or grain side, is used for
the manufacture of thin, fancy lea-
thers used in bookbinding, etc., while
the flesh side is made up into wash
leather. It is first drenched then put
into stocks and pounded until it is
partly dried and the fibrous struc-
ture has become loose and open, saw-
dust generally being employed to fa-
cilitate the process. Fish oil is now
rubbed upon the skins in small quan-
tities, as long as the oil is absorbed.
The moisture dries out as the oil is
absorbed, the skins being hung up
occasionally and exposed to the air.
When the skins have absorbed enough
oil, they lose their limy odor, and
acquire a peculiar mustard-like smell,
due to the oxidation of the oil. They
are then packed loosely in boxes,
where they heat rapidly, and must be
taken out and exposed to the air to
prevent overheating. During this
time they give off much pungent va-
por and turn yellow. They are then
washed in a warm solution of alkali
to remove the excess of fat. The oil
removed is liberated from the soapy
fluid, and sold as "sod soil."
The skins are next bleached in the sun,
being moistened occasionally with a
solution of potassium permanganate,
followed by washing the sulphurous
acid or sodium peroxide. The leath-
er is then permanently softened and
suited for all purposes of toilet or
cleaning uses.

Of course, he will resign his
judgeship, which he has held since
1885, and then his views will become
known. He is strongly favored by
Wall Street and as strongly opposed
by the Bryan wing of the Democracy.
Judge Parker is 52 years of age and
an orator.

Charcoal for Hens.
Charcoal is most excellent for
regulating the bowels of hens. It is
very constipating. I would not feel
that I could raise little chickens un-
less I had powdered charcoal if ne-
cessary, for it is sure to correct any
relaxed bowels. I give it to the
fowls once in three days, and do not
leave it before them all the time, as
it absorbs odors and would get fil-
thy. I pound it up the size of corn
kernels and put out about what the
fowls will soon eat up clear.—Or-
