PROGRESS AGENT ARRESTED.—J. N. Golding, Jr., who went to Halifax from St. John to arrange for the sale of Progress, which newsmen refused to handle, was arrested at the instance of C. J. Spike Esq. claims \$2,000 damages. He claims he has been slandered in Progress.

KILLED.—The friends of William Wells of this place received word on Monday from Boston that he had been killed. He was a train conductor. He was a son of Mr. Geo. Wells and nephew of Albert Favett Esq. He was almost thirty years of age and was a young man of good character. His death is a sad blow to his friends. He was married. The funeral will be held at the residence of Mr. Harry McGrath of Dorchester, by whom he left two children.

ENGLISH MAILS.—Steamer Labrador arrived at Halifax on Sunday morning at 8.50 with the English mails which were at once sent on to Moncton in charge of Conductor Johnson thence on to Campbellton in charge of Conductor Milledge Thomson. The run from Halifax to Campbellton was made in 12 hours and 50 minutes at the rate of about 30 miles per hour including stoppages. This is the first trip this season by way of Halifax.

Mails for England via Halifax closed at Sackville at 17.40 every Friday evening instead of Saturday as heretofore.

Tuesday 27th inst will be a busy day in this locality. The county court meets at Dorchester, the S. & W. Agric. Society meets at Powell's Hall, Sackville, and the fire investigation is then resumed.

OBITUARY.—The death of Mrs. Thomas Henderson of St. John is announced. She was a daughter of the late Andrew Waldon of Dorchester, of whose family Miss Waldon of St. John is now the only survivor. Other sisters were Mrs. Palmer, first wife of Judge Palmer, and Mrs. Upham. Mrs. Henderson was a niece of the late Mr. Waldon. She leaves two sons and three daughters.

WHISKY STOLEN.—Last Thursday night three cases of whiskey consigned to Geo. M. Fairweather Dorchester were left on his veranda by the truckman, the house being locked. Later Mr. Fairweather looked for the liquor and found one case missing. John Doyle an ex-convict was arrested and found guilty by Justice Tait and sent up for trial at the sitting of the county court which opens on 27th inst.

The following officers were elected for the Sackville Parish Liberal Association at the meeting in Chignecto Hall Monday evening:—W. F. George, president; Robt. Lowerison and Albert Anderson, vice presidents; John T. Carter, secretary; and Hiram Copp, treasurer. Delegates to the county meeting in Moncton on 28th inst. were also elected.

ISLAND MAILS.—The Alameda did not get across Monday and Tuesday nights and the mails have been again ordered to the Shediac route. This will likely close the season's traffic via the Cape as the captain of the Alameda does not like to risk his vessel in stormy weather off the Island shore where as yet there is no good means of landing.

THE WEATHER has been very changeable and cold. Sunday was cold. Tuesday morning the thermometer registered 4 above zero at Sackville and 1 below at Moncton. Lumbermen are not likely to be troubled for want of frost this winter. A hole was cut in the ground at Sackville Tuesday morning and the ground was found frozen to a depth of five inches.

THE ESCAPED CONVICTS.—In another column is reported the escape on Friday last of three prisoners from Dorchester penitentiary. They were Horne with about three months to serve; Carter with five; and Johnson a colored man with over a year. After escaping from the guards the runaways made their way through the woods towards Sackville and having lost their way came out at the house of Mr. Joseph Reed Beach Hill about sunrise Saturday morning. They told Mr. Reed that they did not want to hurt anyone or to steal anything but that they must have food. They were asked to enter the house and Horne consented to do so. The other two remained outside. Horne was eating, comfortable. Lawrence appeared and effected his capture. The other two remained in the woods all day and at night burst into the house of Mr. McLeod on the main road and took a considerable quantity of bread, cake, and other eatables and three knives. 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
