Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations

Any person who is the sole head of may homestead a quarter section available Dominion land in Manltobs Saskatchewan or Alberta. The appl cant must appear in person at the De minion Lands Agency or Sub-agence for the district. Entry by promy ma be made at any agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son daughter, brother or sister of intending

Daties-Six months' residence upor and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live a farm of at least 80 acres solely awned and occupied by sim or by his father mother, son, daughter, brother or sie

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarte section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre

Duties-Must reside upon the home stead or pre-empfion six months in each of six years from date of home-tead entry (including the time required a homestead patent) and cultivate fifty

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtait a pre-emption may enter for a purchas-\$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
