several secret meetings of the Northrup and the Crothers men, respectively. The meetings have taken place in the upper rooms. One was in room 13. The attendance had averaged from sixteen to twenty. Sometimes there were less. Every day in the corridors one encounters little groups in which Northrup and Reid are prominent.

Borden is a man of such a high sense of honor that he either refuses to believe that men would be disloyal to leadership or else ignores the possibility as unworthy of his notice.
Doherty Has the Job
As for the changes that Borden may contemplate, it is hard to say. Doherty is already the new lieutenant. Porter is loyal, but unwanted. But Borden does not wish to break with the ex-minister. Hence, the newly George Taylor will not be replaced by another as yet, but will your correspondent understand, retire voluntarily next year. Porter remains as the new chairman of the caucus.

With all the trouble within the ranks, and despite the fact that even Borden's loyal followers admit his lack of tact, still there is absolutely faith among the faithful that Borden will remain in the leadership if the matter is broached at the convention. His support from the party in the house might not be very warm, but the general Conservative public would probably overlook the efforts of the insurgents to remove him.
