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BRITAIN ROUSED

BY "RED VICAR"

Clergyman Hangs Scarlet Flag and Green in Church and Talks Revolution.

Thaxted, Essex, England, Aug. 29.—The few live in comfort and folly by robbing the many.

The rich killed Jesus.

The poor man's friend.

The King, the Empire.

The Rich and their Toadies

Killed Christ.

Our Rulers, the Empire, the Rich.

And those who surround them.

Kill Him Now.

This startling manifesto, chalked on a blackboard, across the entrance to the fine old Gothic church of this quiet English town.

Known as "Red Vicar."

It was written by a clergyman of the state church who is the grandson of an earl, the first Earl of Gainsborough, and the son of a groom of the privy chamber. He is the Rev. Conrad le Despenser Roden Noel, and is best known as "The Red Vicar."

He was presented with the living of Thaxted by a socialist countess, the famous Lady Warwick. His creed has led him to place in his church the red flag of socialism, and the equally revolutionary emblem of Sinn Féin. It has brought him the delicate attentions of Cambridge undergraduates, and has caused the church of England and taken down the offending flags. And it has made him famous, or, if you prefer it, notorious.

This is not to be wondered at, for the Rev. Conrad Noel is an extremist, and declares that communism and socialism were taken from the New Testament. But such is the independence of the parish priest in this church of England that he can apparently do what he likes without interference from the higher authorities. Though he is a servant of the state by reason of the fact that he is a clergyman, he is a patriot, and he can, it seems, preach sedition and revolt from his own pulpit without check. And he certainly does so.

Come into his church and witness a service in progress. It is a picturesque scene. Through the faint blue mist of the all-pervading incense you will notice the splendid and chaste lines of the interior, superb in their medieval beauty. The magnificent organ, the paintings around the walls, and the gay banners and flags, with the glowing vestments of vicar and choir—all strike the eye with a pleasant sense of pageantry.

But the sermon will startle you. Here are some sample extracts from some of the Rev. Conrad recently preached.

Startling Sermons.
