Among the many improvements which the association was asked to consider.

1. Single fare, rapid transit and frequent service.

2. To open up an alternative route by a roadway parallel with Yonge-street.

3. Telephone in each postoffice.

4. Mainland approach to the freight station.

5. Plant shade trees on all avenues.

6. No cattle to be at large on any street.

7. Better police protection.

8. A more economical and efficient system of lighting and water service.

9. Postoffice to include money order, savings bank and telegraph.

10. Name of Yonge to be changed to Eglinton.

11. Seeding and planting of public parks and squares.

12. Action to be taken to reduce representation in the council from 3 to 2 in each ward.

The meeting was opened by presenting the following motion:

Moved by Mr. Hoffman, seconded by Mr. Gardner: Whereas, easy means of access, cheap, frequent and rapid means of transportation are essential elements in the progress of any community, and

whereas, negotiations from time to time to secure for the residents of our town, and for the purpose of inviting them to become residents, the same facility and cheapness of transport as enjoyed by citizens of Toronto, have failed to accomplish anything; be it therefore resolved that the Citizens Association of North Toronto recommend the council to take the necessary steps to secure a highway to be called Yonge-street, leading from the city of Toronto to the northern limits of the town, and to take such additional steps as may be necessary to secure the same facility and cheapness of transport as enjoyed by citizens of Toronto, together with a frequent and rapid service.
