## North AMERICA.

T is obvious, at first View, that the Northern American Continent is more extensive, and far exceeds the whole Continent of Europe; as it extends from the Northward of the Polar Circle, to

8° of Northern Latitude, and Europe is bounded by the 35°th of North Latitude; and in Breadth, from Newfoundland to California, is above 70° of Longitude. It is also obvious, that the Spanish, French, and British Colonies, do not occupy the third Part of that Continent. But the Hudson's Bay Company, by their unlimited Grant, pretend to all the Remainder of it, much greater than the Half of Europe, as they claim all the Countries and Seas beyond the Entrance of the Streights commonly call'd
