## CURRENT TRADB CONDITITNS

ontiario.
A Toronto deaier who recently visited Geutgan bay pointo states that there is much actuvity in the shipping of lumber. Considerable stock solu sounc tame ago ds yet at the malls, but it is being cleared out as speceliny as prosiblie to mahe ioum dur He new cut. 1he number of nyuirics recerved tor stuck shows ao laining oil, and it is expected that a brisk lall trade wall be exparienced. Larger shipments than usual have been made to Chicago this season, and melhigun dealers have bunght quite hboranly un account of the decreused supply in that state. Log run white pine on the Georgian liay brags trom $\$ 17$ to \$i8. Norway pinc is mecting with a good demand, and recent sales have been at satisfactory ligures. Local trade throughout the province is a little quiet, the demand irom retailers having declined on account ol a lalling ofl in the prospective grain crop. In Toronto buitding lumber is bemy called for moderatily, but retaiders report less activity than carlier in the season. The outlook for hardwoods is still uncertan, although manufacturers appear to have every coufidence that the demand will improve and that the present praces will be maintained. It is reported that the combine of furniture manufacturers is making a stroug effort to depress hardwood prices in the hope of buying at roch-bottom figures.

QURBRC AND NBL bruNswick.
The shipments of lumicr fiven the St. Lawrance to the United Kangdom during the month of July were comparatively light. Nutwathstandang that the low freights asc an incentive to send gouds forward, it is expected that the cxports from now unth the clnice of the season will be lamated, as shippers recognize the necessity of giving the British market an opportunity to recover. A few vessels have been chartered for September and October loading at 45 shillings, to Livernool and Iondon. Quebee spruce deals are a little stronger. A higher market for spruce is expected in the Eastern States this fall. Clapboards
are selling quite irecly, as 13 also ce dar shingles, but very few sales of the latter have as yet beon made alours $\$_{2 . y u}$ un Buatua sate ut freight, although $\$ 3$ is gemurally pre dicted by the leading manufucturers. Fully twenty multion feet of logs are hung up on the St. John river, and cannot be moved belore the fall rams, and perhaps not until next spring.

## UNIEED STATES.

The only conclusion that can be reached frem a summary of reports s that the white pine trade of the United States is in a most prosper ous condition. Not lor many years has the stock of unsold lumber in the Lake Superior district been so small. At Ashland, Wis., the stock of unsold Norway and white pine is but 30 , 000,000 fect, as compared with $75,000,000$ tect at the same time last year. Most of the large mills have coutracted for else buik of Lheir seasuns cut, Chacago parties havaug bewn huavy buyers of late. No. 4 boards are now selling in Juluth at \$10.00, short Norvay at $\$ 10.75$, and 6 -inch straps at \$15.50. 'He lath market is strung, No. 1 white pine bringing $\$ 2.75$, and No. 1 Norway $\$ 2.10$ to $\$ 2.25$. In the Signaw valley white phat is moving frecly and prices are stalemng, as stenchs are somewhat broken. Log run is held at \$18 to to \$22, wox at \$15 to \$16, and mill culls at $\$ 12$. The castern whotesule markets are not as active as utey have been, but dealers have cuouga orders allead to keep them, basy for several weeks. Notwithstanding lurge receipts, there is still a scarciky of lue common and better at Tonawanda and Duffalo. Prices geuerally are firm, with the exception of box lumber, which is unseltled. Some dealers are reported to be olfering thas cides of lamidis at a reductan ut \$1 per thousand irom late quotations. Such action is believed to be unwarsantid, and uther dealcis have relused to meet the cut and wall hold thers stuckim until they can get what they regard as a fair price. The spruce trade is not active, biat secent myurrics have developed a scarcaty in certain sizes in the hands of New York and Boston dealers. Suruce lath 13 in good detnand. The tone of the hardwoud market is stiunger. Inguirice are becoming more numerous, whicl leads to the conclusion that a brisk fall trade will develop. Some dealers report a good trade in birch.
