THE STEINMANN DISASTER. HALIFAX, N.S., April 16.—The following letter, signed by John Johnston, Richard O'Neill, and Edward Baynes, is published: "I am, Captain Steinmann, of the wrecked steamer Daniel Steinmann, has stated that he never met a pilot until very close to Chobucto Head, and that each voyage he had to wait some time for the pilot to board his ship. As this statement has been published in a paper, and is untrue, we, the undersigned pilots, who have solemnly pledged the Daniel Steinmann into harbor, deem it our duty in justice to ourselves, and to the pilots of the port of Halifax in general, to contradict the same. On the first voyage the Steinmann was boarded by John Johnston on December 6th, 1883, five miles from Chobucto Head; on her second voyage by Richard O'Neill, on January 30th, 1884, four miles from Chobucto Head; and on her third voyage by Edward Baynes on February 7th, 1884, four miles from Chobucto Head. Each time the weather was clear and in the daytime; we are certain that Capt. Steinmann lost no time in looking or waiting for a pilot, except in stopping his ship to take the pilot on board, which he did not do in a proper manner, as she was going at the rate of 3 or 4 knots an hour when the pilot boat went alongside."

THE DYNAMITERS IN ENGLAND. LONDON, April 16.—The Liverpool police have been ordered to send all the evidence they obtain concerning Daly to the home department, which will undertake the prosecution. It is expected that the trial of Daly will take place at Birmingham. Bagnall's documents are still being retained in regard to their contents. Mr. Daly's solicitor has had an interview with his clients. He says Daly is a very resolute and determined man. Daly denies all knowledge of Fitzgerald, the Panian arrested last week in London and taken to Bilgou. He admits, however, that he was acquainted with Egan, but only as a lodger. He had no connection with Egan's movements. The defence will be totally different from that of Featherstone.

DYNAMITE PLOTTERS. DETECTIVES MANUFACTURING GREEN. (SPECIAL FROM OTTAWA). OTTAWA, April 16. Sir John A. Macdonald is excessively pestered with all kinds of crank calls and petitions to make wonderful revelations regarding the mysterious dynamites. The Premier is at length waking up to the fact that a class of impostors exist who are stirring up the dynamite question in order that they may get place and pelf. In every large city there are a number of reckless cranks and crooks to be found, who for a few dollars are ready to undertake any job, provided it does not involve immediate danger to themselves. Not only the British, but the Canadian Government, are now employing, at good pay, a large number of detectives, informers, spies, and such people, to keep a lookout for dynamite makers.

FRANCE AND HER INTERESTS. PARIS, April 16.—At Perignen yesterday Noye said that France could never allow foreign interference with her legitimate interests in Europe. The French Democracy could exercise a peaceful and salutary influence on Europe which had suffered in the past from failure to preserve the proper balance of power. He thought the time had arrived when the country could discuss a revision of the constitution. The Government favored a moderate revision based upon the actual terms of the constitution now in force.

THE INTERESTING INCIDENTS accompanying the recent heavy winds are beginning to come in. A North Carolina man, whose house was demolished, afterward found his watch hanging on a small limb of a tree that had been blown down in the yard, the chain wrapped several times around the limb. It was ticking away as if nothing had happened.
