

The question being put on the said motion, it was—
Resolved in the affirmative.

The question being again put on the motion for the third reading of the Bill, as amended—

The Honourable Senator Euler moved:—

That the Bill be not now read a third time, as amended, but that Bills (88) and (101) be consolidated as follows:—

To subsection three of section eighty of the Special War Revenue Act, as enacted by clause eight of Bill eighty-eight, add the following (being the proviso contained in Bill 101):—

“Provided, however, that the foregoing exemption shall not extend to the goods mentioned in paragraph two of Schedule II to this Act when used in the manufacturing of goods mentioned in paragraphs two and eight of Schedule I to this Act,”

And that Bill (101) be not further proceeded with.

The question being put on the said motion, it was—
Resolved in the affirmative.

The question being again put on the motion for the third reading of the Bill, as amended, and as consolidated with Bill (101), it was—
Resolved in the affirmative.

The said Bill, as amended, and as consolidated with Bill (101), was then read the third time.

The question was put whether this Bill, as amended, and as consolidated with Bill (101), shall pass.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry this Bill back to the House of Commons and acquaint them that the Senate has passed the same with an amendment, and with the incorporation therein of Bill (101) of the House of Commons, intituled: “An Act to amend the Special War Revenue Act,” to which they desire their concurrence.

The Order of the Day being called for the third reading of the Bill (101), intituled: “An Act to amend the Special War Revenue Act,” it was—
Ordered, That the said Bill be not further proceeded with.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill (87), intituled: “An Act to amend the Income War Tax Act,” was read the third time.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That a Message be sent to the House of Commons to acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, without any amendment.

The Order of the Day being called for the third reading of the Bill (98), intituled: “An Act to authorize the provision of moneys to meet certain expenditures made and capital indebtedness incurred by the Canadian National Railways System during the calendar year 1941, to provide for the refunding of financial obligations and to authorize the guarantee by His Majesty of certain securities to be issued by the Canadian National Railway Company,” it was—

Ordered, That the said Order of the Day be postponed until to-morrow.
