HISTORIC SITES AND MONUMENTS ACT

AMENDMENTS RESPECTING BOARD MEMBERSHIP, REMUNERATION, ETC.

The house resumed from Wednesday, May 14, consideration of the motion of Mr. MacEachen that Bill C-153, to amend the Historic Sites and Monuments Act, be read the third time and do pass.

Mr. Harold E. Winch (Vancouver East): Mr. Speaker, it was my hope to be able to make a few comments on the bill which is now before us, namely Bill C-153 which deals with historic sites and monuments. As all members have undoubtedly noted, there are only two principles in the bill. The first is to provide for membership on the board of an officer of the National Museums of Canada, and the second is to provide that the remuneration paid to members of the board appointed by the Governor in Council for attending at meetings or to other business of the board is to be fixed by the Governor in Council.

These two principles regarding the operation of the Historic Sites and Monuments Board are open for consideration and discussion. That is why I desire to make a few comments on them. Over the years I have had a great interest in the work of this board, but I have been disappointed in some of the policies adopted by the board and also in the fact that greater support and money has not been made available to the board.
