THE PRINCIPAL: Do you consider the Prote stant Committee, as $r$ ecommended, to be vague and cumbersome?

PRO F. HUGHES : I th ink it depends on how it functions. If it does its work by sub-comittees, I don't think it would be to o cumber some. I think, the number of the committees is pretty well determined by the number of the Catholic wing of the Council of Fducation.

 PRO. HUGHES: Yes. Six, if I remember righ.
 DEAN BRITTAN: Ther ewas ariticism mad We were told that the Commit tee was misled by the name of the assoc ia tion, which represents only a very few of the School Boards.
 PROF HUGHES: I think this is a body of fairly recent growth. It had to be taken into ac oount and recognized that it was the only body representing rural school or boerds, as cossrasted with the Greater Montreal Boards.
