God calls some men to lay the foundations of His palace, while others form the turrets and ornament the imposing portions of His great spiritual building. If He calls an Isaiah and a Jeremiah to proclaim in glowing language the coming of the King and His march among the nations, if He calls some to be apostles and evangelists, He also calls others to serve tables and reveal the beauty of the Christ-life in simple devotion. In all true service the spirit with which the task is done is the test of greatness. The hewers of wood and the drawers of water who do their work well are greater in the sight of God than the High Priests who render
