

Her marriage
annulled.

1. The said marriage between the said Mary Matilda White and David Crystal White is hereby dissolved and is and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

She may
marry again.

2. The said Mary Matilda White may at any time here- 5
after marry any man whom she might lawfully have married
in case the said marriage had not been solemnized.

Rights of her
subsequent
issue.

3. In the event of the said Mary Matilda White hereafter
marrying, she and the man whom she so marries, and the
issue, if any, of any such marriage, shall have and possess 10
the same rights in every respect as if her said marriage with
the said David Crystal White had never been solemnized.

Certain real
estate to be
conveyed to
her.

4. The said David Crystal White shall within one month
from the passing of this Act, by a good and sufficient deed 15
of conveyance in fee simple, to be approved of by the Judge
of the County Court of the County of Norfolk, grant and
convey unto the said Mary Matilda White, her heirs and
assigns, free from incumbrances, lot number thirty-seven,
West St. Andrew's street, in the Village of Port Dover, in the
County of Norfolk, and such approval by the Judge aforesaid, 20
shall be endorsed upon the said deed.

Registration
of such con-
veyance.

5. Before and until the making and approval of the said
deed this Act may be registered in the registry office for the
County of Norfolk; and such registration shall have the
same force and effect as the registration of an order or decree 25
of the High Court of Justice for the Province of Ontario.
