Easy Prices Were Maintained in Butcher Cattle Until Close.

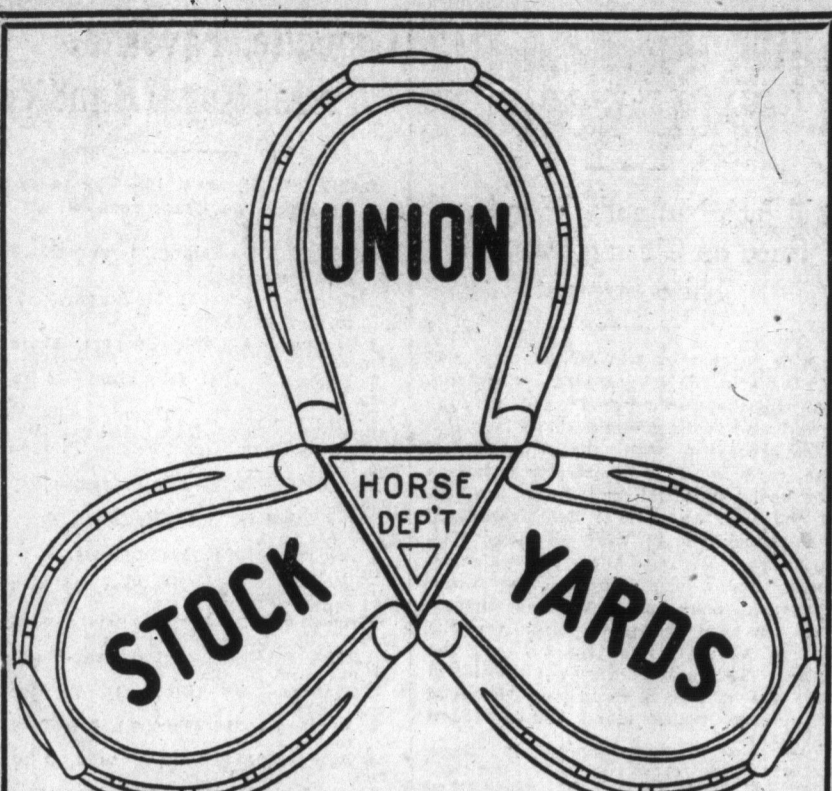
The receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Yards on Thursday numbered 43 cars, including 251 cattle, 259 hogs, 1207 sheep and lambs...
