DEAR DR. LESUEUR,—

At the request of Sir Sandford Fleming, Chairman of the Committee appointed to consider two resolutions submitted by Dr. Adami and myself respecting a proposed increase in the number of Sections of the Society, I now transmit the following papers for the consideration of the Council:—

1. Copy of a letter from yourself to Sir Sandford Fleming transmitting a protest from Dr. T. Wesley Mills.
2. Copy of a circular addressed by me, under instructions, to the members of the committee, enclosing copies of both resolutions, and of Dr. T. Wesley Mills' protest.
