BE it enacted by the Mayor, Aldermen and Common-alty of the City of Toronto, in Common Council The I Assembled.

SECTION I.

That the Mayor shall sign all Licenses to retailers of d Vict Ale, Beer and Cider, Butchers, Cartmen, Showmen and the s. Keepers of Ordinaries or Victualing Houses, and the side. Chamberlain shall countersign the same.

SECTION II.

Two pounds shall be annually paid for each Licence thout anted to a keeper of an Ordinary or Victualing house all for granted to a keeper of an Ordinary or Victualing house, or house of entertainment for the purpose of selling Ale, fence t Beer or Cider, or of a house where victuals or cordials or und, a any other manufactured beverage may be sold, to be eaten nce sh or drank therein, within the said City or the Liberties ne day,

SECTION III.

All Licences that may be granted by the authority of this Law, shall expire on the first Tuesday in June, of every Every year. an ore
