An implement agent told me to-day that his firm had \$80,000 outstanding but could not \$80,000 outstanding but could not collect more than one-tenth of what was due. Grain commission firms, I hear, are beginning to send out notices to the effect that they will not advance more than \$200 on a car until the latter is inspected. I find that the storekeepers here have received the circular from the Winnipeg Credit Men's Association with regard to a suspension of the Maniteba Grain Act in favor of the elevators, the idea being to permit the elevators to get out the tough grain of small farmers. A local storekeeper told me that he had not been able to get signatures to the petition except odd ones. It was no use, he said, broaching the question to farmers, as they would not look at it twice.
