Aldermen Blame Government for Condition of Lunatics Confined in Toronto Jail.

COULD NOT AGREE ON A REPORT

Conservative Members of the Investigating Committee Disagreed With the Liberals

There was a strong suspicion of political party feeling evident at the meeting yesterday of the Civic Subcommittee, which is investigating the conditions surrounding the detention of lunatics at the jail. The Conservative nembers of the committee denounced the Ontario government for allowing the present state of affairs to exist, while the Liberal members advocated further inquiry. Each side accused the other of trying to burk the in-

Ald. Richardson introduced a resoution, exonerating the jail officials and censuring the government. The surroundings in which the unfortunates were found at the jail on the day of the committee's visit were, in the opinion of Chairman Burns, the fault of the jail officials, and not of the Province, Ald. Hall said Ald. Burns was afraid to roast the govern-




