PRIEST CENSURES BLAKE Distribution of Recent Pamphle Evokes a Protest.

WINNIPEG, Man., Sept. 27.-During the commemorative services in St. Mary's Catholic Cemetery on the afternoon of the 18th, someone entered the vacant church and scattered broadcast, copies of Hon. S. H. Blake's pamphlet on the "Book of Uncommor Discord."

The rector, Rev. Father Dalton, wrote Mr. Blake protesting against the action of Mr. Blake's disciple, and receiving no acknowledgement of his letter, at last night's vespers said Mr. Blake was one of the last of those who endeavored to force a yoke of their own doctrines on others, a yoke which had resulted in the Puseyite movement early in the last century. He declared the pamphlet contained no scholarship, but was simply a denunciation in exe-crable taste of Catholic doctrines in language painful to Catholics.
