

ALL RANKS OF POLICE ASK LARGER SALARIES

Request Will Be Before Commissioners Next Week—One Day Off a Week.

Requests for an advance in salary from nearly every rank of the force will be before the police commissioners when they meet Tuesday afternoon.

The men on the beat are asking for a \$100 annual raise for first, second and third class constables, which would bring the scale up to \$1,000, \$900 and \$800 respectively.
