CANALS IN THE LANDSCAPE. Presence of Water Has Wonderful Effect on Scenery.

The difference in the scenery of the countryside brought by the construction of the great network of canals which was put together in the sixty years or so which preceded the general adoption of the railway, is at this distance of time difficult even to imagine, says The London Spectator. The added presence or water in any landscape alters the whole atmosphere.
