WHERE LACROSSE IS BOOMING

Players at Johns Hopkins University Are Already in Training.

BALTIMORE, Dec. 17.—The regular practice of the winter of the lacrosse team of the Johns Hopkins University began this afternoon in the case and will continue four times weekly until time for outdoor work next spring at Homewood.

The outlook this year is better than for years. Eight of the 12 varsity men of last season are still at the university. Erlanger, coverpoint; Knapp, outman; Babin, inman; and Capt. Tough, third defence, are those who have not returned. For their positions the coaches and Capt. Schmeisser have men in view. For Erlanger's place at coverpoint the choice seems to be unanimously for ex-Capt. Houston, a freshman and a prominent member of the City College team of last year. He is expected to make good. The two home places on the attack at present seem to be a struggle between Malchin, in variety substitute of last year, and Hayne and Clary, both members of the freshman class and former City College stars. Hayne is captain of the freshman twelve and has unusual speed and stickwork.

Manager Wright has scheduled games with Harvard, Columbia, Stevens Institute, Swarthmore and Edgemoor. Negotiations are pending with Cornell and the University of Toronto. National Ticket Brokers Association Takes Up Question. CHICAGO, Dec. 17.—A demand that all railroad tickets be issued to "bearer" without compulsory signature of the purchaser, was made at a meeting of the executive committee of the National Ticket Brokers' Association here yesterday.
