Material Setback in Price in Chicago—More Canadian Wheat Arrives.

Chicago, Nov. 4.—Wheat underwent a material setback in price today, owing more or less to talk that country offerings were larger. The market closed nervous, 3 1/2 to 5 1/2 net lower, with December \$2.00 1/2 to \$2.01, and March \$1.94 1/2 to \$1.95. Corn finished to down to 5 1/2 up; oats off 1/2 to 3/4, and provisions varied from the decline to an advance. Downward turn for wheat values began as soon as trading opened, and it was said a house with southwestern country wheat was short on the market.
