In Joint Action.
At a joint mid-week meeting of the Euclid Avenue Methodist Church and the Memorial Baptist Church the following resolution was unanimously adopted by a large audience: "That whereas a dual school system of education promotes strife and leaves unqualified teachers and competent inspectors offers the only worthy solution for the education of peace-loving people composed of various nationalities and different religions, while offering the highest opportunities to the denser population, we deplore the introduction by Sir Wilfrid Laurier of a bill to inflict the Alberta and Saskatchewan Provinces with separate school systems. We greatly favor a national school system producing harmony and efficiency among the rising generation."

Bridge Advantages.
Inasmuch as sounding board bridges have so much to do with the production of a resonant and sonorous tone in a piano, there is particular interest in glancing at the method of manufacture. As the Goulay, the bridges are made of quarter-sawn maple, glued together in continuous bent form, thus avoiding the possibility of splitting under the pressure of the strings. Moreover, the Goulay has a third Grand Bass Bridge, which has not hitherto been used in upright pianos, but which has been regarded as a prime necessity in all grands. One advantage is that the middle strings of the instrument are greatly enriched in tone, and that all sections are equalized in tone production.
