AN ACT

TO INCORPORATE THE

Canada Baptist Missionary Society.

(8 VICTORIA, CHAPTER 46.)

Whereas it has been represented to the Legislature of this Province, that divers inhabitants thereof, who have constituted themselves a Society by the name and style of The Canada Baptist Missionary Society, having for its object the educa. tion of pious young men for the Christian Ministry, and general education, and also the support of Ministers of the Baptist denomination and others, whilst engaged in preaching the Gospel or communicating religious instruction in Canada, have used their efforts to establish a College in the City of Montreal, in the District of Montreal, and are engaged in erecting and establishing the same: And whereas, it would tend greatly to advance and extend the usefulness of the said College and to promote the purposes for which it was established, that the said Canada Baptist Missionary Society should be incorporated: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, intituled, An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada, and it is hereby enacted, by the authority of the same, That there shall be and there is hereby constituted and established in the said City of Montreal, in the District of Montreal, a body politic and corporate under the name of "The Canada Baptist Missionary Society," which said Corporation shall consist of the Rev. John Mockett Cramp, A.M., the Rev. John Girdwood, the Rev. Frederick Bosworth, John Try, James Thomson, the elder, Joseph Wenham, James Milne, Robert Morton, Robert Drake, Thomas Churchill, John Dunn, James Mills, James Hearle.
