WOMAN SUFFRAGE

This week's discussion of woman suffrage at the Social Service Congress, followed by a strong resolution in favor of extending the franchise to women, adds interest to Hon. Dr. Pugsley's resolution in parliament.

The experiences of the war have added enormously to the force of the movement for woman suffrage, and as long ago as a year before the outbreak of the war Mr. Lloyd George, now prime minister of England, said:

"I have long been a convinced advocate of woman suffrage, and as a woman I am not in a position to say that it is a necessary and desirable consequence of the vast extension of the functions of government which the last century and a half has witnessed.
