AMHERST MAN WOUNDED

Private J. H. Kane, of the 10th Battalion, first contingent, wounded at Langemarck, is a son of Mrs. Kane of Amherst. Both Mrs. Kane and her late husband are descendants of a family of soldiers. Mr. Kane had served with the colors. Two other sons are now preparing to fight. One is with a Highland Regiment ready to start for the front. The other is in Halifax with the 5th Battalion. Private J. H. Kane is not seriously wounded and will be discharged from the hospital very soon.

The death of Gen. England, aged seventy-eight years, occurred at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Thos. McFarlane, Middle Island, Miramichi, on Friday evening. He leaves one son, Robert of Loggieville, and two daughters, Mrs. Thos. McFarlane and Mrs. Harris; two brothers, Peter and John, and a large number of grand and great-grandchildren.

A BANGOR PAPER ROASTS GERMANS

(Bangor Commercial)

The White Dove was driven screaming from its perch Friday at the Women's International Peace Congress at The Hague. One of the Belgian lady delegates to whom close proximity of the German and Austrian members appears to have been too much, rose and addressed the session, declaring that while she was for peace in the abstract she was not for a moment in favor of ending the present war until final justice had been done.

No one can blame this woman of a cultured land. She has seen the homes of her people despoiled, their lands overrun, industries destroyed, women and children shot down in the streets and the prosperity of a nation laid waste all because of "military necessity." Nothing will satisfy any Belgian woman or any Belgian man or child of the present generation or of generations to come but justice.

Justice means driving the Germans out of Belgium, and making them pay in so far as money can pay for the desolation they have wrought. But it means more than this. No justice can be secured for either Belgium or for the rest of Europe, or for the rest of the world so long as the German "Welt-politik" is expressed in terms of rapine, shells and machine guns. German military power must be smashed first before the world can begin to expect the peace for which it longs. It is not only death to the military machine as it exists today, but death to the militaristic principles that must be accomplished.

I. C. R. CHANGES

F. P. Brady to West and R. Colclough Mentioned as Successor

(Moncton Transcript.)

F. P. Brady arrived in the city from Montreal by special train early on Sunday morning. It is learned that he expects to leave again this evening for Montreal, where he will spend some time prior to taking up his duties as N. T. R. superintendent at Cochrane, Ontario. It has been rumored for some time that Mr. Brady was to be appointed superintendent of the I. C. R. operated portion of the N. T. R., with headquarters at Cochrane or Winnipeg. He will be under Mr. Gutelius, who as general manager of government railways, will have general oversight of the government operated section of the N. T. R. It is reported that several officials of the I. C. R. will go to this section of the N. T. R., and that there will be numerous vacancies to be filled here.

W. E. Barnes, district master mechanic, left for Montreal and points west on Saturday night, and it is reported that he is to take a position as master mechanic at Transcona, Manitoba. Joseph Graham, superintendent of Moncton locomotive shop is said to be slated for a similar position at a point on the western lines of the N. T. R. Richard Colclough, formerly of Moncton, now superintendent at Lewis is mentioned as a probable successor to Mr. Brady, as general superintendent of the I. C. R.
