BASEBALL.

Leo Callahan. The following item appeared in a recent issue of the Boston Globe: "A Jamaica Plain boy, formerly a Greater Boston High School pitcher—Leo Callahan—was one of the stars of the Worcester team in the Eastern League this season."

Callahan pitched for the High School of Commerce team here in Boston several years ago and has to his credit a no-hit, no-run game while performing in the scholastic ranks. He was given a tryout by Brooklyn and then spent a number of seasons in the International League, playing mostly in the outfield, and five times batting for better than .300.

In 1919 he played in the Philly outer garden and the last two years has been playing in Worcester.

Notes—It will be recalled that Leo Callahan played here for the Marathons. He pitched a couple of games, but was one of the regular outfielders and although very small in stature and build was one of the most consistent and heaviest hitters on the team.

Warns Boxing Promoters. Hartford, Conn., Nov. 5.—New York boxers and boxing promoters were singled out for special mention in a statement made by Moses King, athletic instructor at Yale and Chairman of the State Boxing Commission, decrying the practice of putting on bouts of doubtful merit.

LOCAL NEWS St. George's church, West Side, is celebrating its one hundredth anniversary tomorrow.
