"At four o'clock on Wednesday afternoon, October 28th, General deWet entered Vrede with about 150 mounted nich, of whom half to two-thirds were armed. After passing through the town gate a chase ensued after a post office clerk, who had been posted on the outskirts of the town to form an estimate of de Wet's force as they approached. The clerk, mounted on a bicycle, managed to retain the lead from several horsemen, in spite of their threats to shoot him. 


