

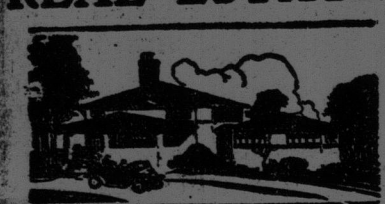

PRESIDENT STANDS BY CURRENCY BILL

Washington, June 24—President Wil-
son freely discussed the Glass currency
bill, with the Washington correspondents
yesterday and made it plain that he in-
tends to stand as firmly behind it as he
does behind the tariff bill. The general
principles of the bill, Mr. Wilson con-
siders clearly defensible but he expected
to add amendments for detail.
Washington, June 24—The minority
attitude toward the president's currency
plans was reflected in a statement made
by Representative Mann, of Illinois, as
the president's message is a fine ex-
ample of classic English," said the state-
ment, "but there is nothing more to it
unless it be considered as a threat that
patronage will be held until a banking
and currency bill is passed. I wish to
co-operate with these in favor of passing
a reasonable banking and currency bill,
but the president evidently intends to
treat the subject as one purely partisan,
and he did not take the trouble even to
discuss or analyze the principles involv-
ed in banking and currency legislation.
He erred in saying that the committee
of congress had consulted with him and
prepared a bill."
