And may we all more and more experience a deepening in the root of divine life, in order that we may bring forth fruit to the prais: of Him who is everlastingly worthy.

Finally, brethren, may "the God of peace, that brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great Shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant, make you perfect in every good work to do His will, working in you that which is well pleasing in His sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen.
